

Growing in Community

God created mankind for relationship; first with Him and then with others. While culture today, especially in the United States, tends to be very individualistic, it is not Biblical. Christians are the *Body of Christ* and it means that there should be relationship, connection and unity among Christians. Paul wrote in Ephesians 4 that the Lord gives different gifts so that the body of Christ may be built up. Educational research has found that adults learn better when they are able to provide input and contribute to the discussion; essentially, people learn and grow in community and small groups are where adults learn and grow best.

Yet, culture today insists that we can learn on our own and grow our own way. Again, the Bible addresses this; Proverbs 16:25 tells us that, "There is a way that seems right to a man, but in the end it leads to death." Our own way tends to or can lead us astray rather than the right way. We need community, the Body of Christ, to help us grow in our knowledge of God and challenge us to walk in the Spirit.

This holds true in marriage also. A recent, nationwide study found that 95% of people do not want a marriage like there parents have. Wow! So if we are not learning how to build healthy marriages from our parents, where do we learn about marriage? Well, usually from our parents, although, most often, we learn many wrong ways to live in relationship. Or we learn from the media - movies and television. Or we just figure it out for ourselves; doing what seems right, but this has led to a nearly 50% divorce rate, even in the church. So, how do we learn? Learning God's plan for marriage from His word. That seems easy enough and there are many who teach that we are only to use God's word for counseling and teaching, but as the Ethiopian eunuch answered Philip in Acts 8, how can I understand, "unless someone explains it to me?" Couples getting together to study God's principles for marriage learn from God's word and each other and can better implement sound practices into their marriage relationships.

Marriage *is* a difficult relationship - we need to learn God's plan for our marriages and implement the tools that can help us live out His plan for our marriages. We learn and grow in community, why not get together with a group of couples who want to develop strong, healthy marriages and grow together? There are many great resources available to help us grow in our marriage relationships.
